How to get there

By Train

3 main international railway stations: Eastern (Keleti), Western (Nyugati) and Southern (Déli).

50 trains/day between Budapest and European capital cities.

All three international railway stations are part of the Budapest Underground system, the Metró. The Déli and Keleti are stops on the Red (Number 2) line and the Nyugati is on the Blue (Number 3) line.

By Plane

Airport connexions:

- The public airport bus, BKV bus number 200E goes to M3 station Kőbánya-Kispest (blue line), about 20 minutes away. From there, the metro takes passangers straight into the city centre.
- Trains commute between the airport and Nyugati Railway Station. The train ticket price is about HUF 370-615 per person.


